

PALM SUNDAY

Dear friends,

On both Palm Sunday and Good Friday, we will hear the whole narration of the Passion, from Jesus' condemnation to His Death on the Cross.

As a child, I must admit that I always thought that it was a I-o-n-g Gospel! But at the same time, each year, I appreciate how much it reveals.

It reveals the human heart. It reveals the tenderness and bravery of St. Veronica or Simon of Cyrene. It reveals, too, how fear can paralyze us.

It reflects, in some ways, our own suffering. Or rather, when we suffer, we can find there in the Gospel our Lord, Jesus, who understands our sorrow and pain... that very fact can comfort and strengthen us. St. Anthony of Padua said, "Christians must lean on the Cross of Christ just as travelers lean on a staff when they begin a long journey. They must have the Passion of Christ deeply embedded in their minds and hearts, because only from it can they derive peace, grace, and truth."

The reading of the Passion reveals, above all, just how much Jesus loved us and continues to love us.

Friends, let us strive to be kind to others, to help our friends, relatives and family members to carry their Cross. Jesus is moved when He sees us doing so, following His example.

FACTS OF FAITH

Holy Week Part Two

Last week we spoke about Christ's triumphant entrance into Jerusalem and followed His footsteps from Palm Sunday to Holy Thursday. **Easter Triduum** (pronounced tridyoo-uhm) begins on Holy Thursday and ends with the evening of Easter Sunday. This time is also known as the Paschal Triduum.

"Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery" (USCCB)

Paschal Mystery is God's plan of redemption for the fallen human race through the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ who was both God and Man. It is one marvelous event stretched out over three days. (The Catholic Company Apr 04, 2017)

Good Friday - On Good Friday, there is no Mass. The Tabernacle is open to show that it is empty and the candle by the Tabernacle has been blown out. The Altar is bare and the consecrated Hosts were removed on Holy Thursday to the "Altar of repose". This tells us that Jesus has been Crucified and is gone.

Why do we call it Good Friday?


On Good Friday Jesus died and saved us from our sins, His Death and Resurrection are the most sacred times of our year. Jesus suffered for us, and saved us, this is why we call it Good. Our reverence, prayers and fasting on Good Friday are our way of showing gratitude.

The Good Friday readings tell us the story of Christ's arrest, torture, and death. We Venerate the Cross and share in a Communion service. It is a day of solemn prayer. We can take part in the **Stations of the Cross** at 9:00am and participate in one of the Good Friday **Services** at 12:00pm or 3:00pm. Good Friday is a day to slow down and spend time with God, reflecting on the agony of Jesus' sacrifice for us.

Easter Vigil is the most beautiful Mass of the year. It begins in a quiet dark Church, representing the world of darkness before the light of Christ. Outside, a bonfire is lit and from this one source of light the Paschal Candle is lit and then spread to the candles that are held by the parishioners. Slowly the light of Christ fills the Church, and our celebration of the risen Christ begins.

We listen to the history of our faith: readings from the Old and New Testaments are read, as the Old Testament is revealed in the New Testament and the New Testament is hidden in the Old Testament. The music is rich in tradition, and we welcome new catechumens to the Catholic Faith.

Easter Sunday is the final day of the Triduum and is a continuation of the celebration of the risen Christ. We celebrate the glory of Jesus' Resurrection and Death conquered.






